The Forest Lake city website has information by clicking the box near the top of the home page labeled "Veterans Memorial", and then on the next page near the bottom click on "Granite Memorial Paver" in the narrative to see the brochure and the form to fill out listing your veteran's name and info. One side of the brochure lists the small 4 inch by 8 inch paver for \$150, and the back side of the brochure lists the large 8 inch by 16 inch paver for \$300. Submit your form and tax deductible donation to the Forest Lake city hall. As soon as there are enough funds we will have the engineering done and proceed.
